INSTRUCTIONS

How to use the sensory family devos in this book: SENSE – each activity, whether it's a craft or a memory, involves one of the five senses. Let your child know which you will be using each day.

SCRIPTURE—Begin by reading the scripture. As parents you might have heard the story "a million times" but your kids haven't. However, don't get bogged down trying to read the account from every Gospel. Please read all of the passages listed by yourself beforehand and then you can judge, based on your kids' ages and attention span, how much to read to them. As you read the Scripture, instruct your kids to imagine they are in the story.

ACTIVITY—After you have read the Scripture, lead your children in the activity. As you make the craft or journey through your experience, talk about the Scripture and the sense being used. Depending on the age of your children, the activity or craft may look different. It's OK! The point is not to do or be perfect but to experience God's Word.

TALK—This section is written in first person so you can read it to your children. It is a starting point and a conversation starter. It's not supposed to be a big theological discussion and let's face it, your kids might end up talking about superheroes or bumblebees instead. The main point is to get them talking and internalizing the Scripture.

EXTRA GAMES/PUZZLES—also included for each day are puzzles, games, activities and even some extra crafts...but they are optional. Everyone learns differently and you know your kids best, so let them loose to do none, one or all of these extras.

NOTE: The story of Jesus' death and resurrection is a hard one. People and churches have debated the details and even the veracity of it for centuries. Pastors and professors still don't know and understand every detail of this rich story.

So, why do we think we can or should relate


this story to our children?

It's not a story to be understood, dissected and fact-checked. It's a story to be experienced. A story to be awed by. A story to believe in. And children are the best at belief. As you walk through the story with your children, use these devotionals as a guide. But use your relationship with Jesus, your walk with Him and your heart to convey these truths to your children. Impress this story on their hearts and minds. (You might want to read the article on page 25 on how to talk to your children about death before starting these devotionals.)

Devotionals are taken (and sometimes modified) from the book "A SENSE OF THE RESURRECTION" by Amanda White.

MARY'S PERFUME

DAY1—SMELL

You smell the perfume to prepare your heart for Jesus' déath

READ IT TOGETHER:

John 12:1-8; Matthew 26:6-13; Mark 14:1-9; Luke 7:36-50

MAKE IT TOGETHER (DIFFUSER):

Supplies: reeds (or bamboo skewers), small mouth jars (spice jars, baby food jars, etc.), liquid potpourri (òr essential oils), scrapbook paper, ribbons, stickers, or other assorted decorations.


- Decorate jars with paper, ribbons, and stickers
- Pour 1-2 inches of liquid potpourri into each jar
- Place 4-6 reeds into each jar
- 4. Place each jar in a different room of the house (dependent on how many kids you have)

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

Jesus said Mary anointed Him to prepare Him for His death and burial. When she broke the jar and


perfume spilled out, the Book of John says, "and the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume."

When we smell the perfume in our house, let's remember that Jesus died for us. We can try to say a guick prayor like "thank You Laws for this for quick prayer like, "thank You Jesus for dying for me!" each time we notice the perfume. Let's be like Mary and prepare our hearts for Jesus' death.



WASHING FEET

DAY 3-FEEL

You will feel Jesus, the Servant King.

READ IT TOGETHER: John 13:1-17

DO IT TOGETHER (FEET WASHING): Supplies: bowls/bins of soapy water, towels

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

Was it funny to have someone wash your feet? What did it feel like to wash someone else's feet? What do you think it was like when Jesus washed the disciples' feet?



DAY 4-TASTE

You eat and taste Jesus' body broken for you.

READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 26:26-30; Mark 14:22-26; Luke 22:14-20

MAKE IT TOGETHER (BREAD):
Supplies: a special loaf of bread

(matzo or challah would be perfect)

 After reading the Bible passage, make or heat up your loaf of bread and serve it as a special treat.

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

Jesus and His disciples were eating a special, traditional meal called "Seder." This meal reminded them of the many things God had done for the Israelite people in the past. Then, Jesus takes the bread in the meal and uses it to tell His friends what God was going to do very soon.

What did He do with the bread? That's right, He broke it. Jesus already told us that He is the bread of Life (John 6:35). Jesus used bread to show us what would happen to His body = that it would be broken and hurt for us when He died on the cross.

When we eat this bread, let's imagine what it was like when Jesus broke the bread and explained this to the disciples.



READ IT TOGETHER: Matthew 27:11-31; John 19:1-16

MAKE IT TOGETHER (WINDOW ART):

Supplies: liquid soap, water, purple cellophane (found at craft stores)

- Combine two parts soap to one part water.
- 2. Cut cellophane in squares, hearts, strips, or other shapes.
- Spread soap and water on window.
- 4. Press cellophane into the soap mixture.
- Place shapes into cross shape.


TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:


The soldiers weren't putting the purple robe on Jesus because they thought He was the King; they did it to make fun of Him. They did not believe Jesus was the King of Kings.

When we see the purple cross on our window, let's remember that Jesus really is our King. Let's thank Him for loving us enough to be beaten, made fun of, and even die for us.



READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 26:31-35, 69-75; Mark 14:27-31, 66-72; Luke 22:31-34, 54-62; John 13:31-38, 18:1-18, 25-27



MAKE IT TOGETHER (MOD PODGE ART):

Supplies: small canvas or piece of blank cardboard, rooster template/outline, scrapbook paper, Mod Podge (or white glue), paint, and brushes, alphabet sticker (optional)

- Paint your canvas desired color.
- Use the rooster template (you can google "rooster shape template") to cut rooster shape out of scrapbook paper.
- 3. Once the paint has dried, glue down the rooster shape. Use alphabet stickers to spell "remember" or hand paint the words.

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

Just a few hours before Jesus' arrest, Jesus and His disciples had dinner (Remember the bread?) and Jesus told them He would be arrested and that all of His disciples would run away. The disciples couldn't believe this. Peter said, "Never! I'll die for you."

Jesus said to Peter, "Before the rooster crows, you will say three times that you don't know me."

So, when Peter heard the rooster crow later that night, he remembered what Jesus said. And it made

Peter sad. He had been so scared he forgot how much he loved Jesus, forgot all the great things Jesus had done for him!

Let's keep our rooster picture up to remember to tell everyone we know about Jesus. Let's remember to never be afraid to talk about all the great things Jesus has done for us.

READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 27:32-44; Mark 15:21-32; Luke 23:26-33; John 19:16-27

DO IT TOGETHER (DRAW):

Supplies: red marker

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

In Jesus' time, criminals were nailed on crosses. We know that Jesus was not a criminal! In fact, He had never done anything wrong.

He had never done anything wrong.
It was horrible to be nailed to the cross. It was painful and embarrassing. Why did He have to die like that? Why didn't He do a miracle and get off the cross?

He died on the cross because He loves you. He let them nail His hands and feet to the cross so He could die in your place. (Romans 3:23, 6:23, 5:8)


We're going to put this red dot on our hands to remind us of the marks where the nails went into Jesus' hands. When we see them today, let's remember how much Jesus loves us!



TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

Jesus drank vinegar just before He died. Let's try some and see how it must have tasted. Was it good?


Yuck! No way!


tastes, remember how horrible sin is. Remember that Jesus took that bitterness, that sin into Himself.





EMOTIONS EXPERIMENT

Materials: food coloring, baking soda, vinegar, squirt bottle or regular water bottle, cupcake tin, storage tub the cupcake tin fits inside

4. Who was the one who first saw Jesus when he emerged from the Prep: put a drop or two of food dye in each cup of the muffin tin and then a teaspoon of baking soda over it to hide the coloring. They will have no idea there was a hidden color under each pile of baking soda, and different colors at that. Place the tin inside the tub and put vinegar into the spray/water bottle.

Read: Matthew 5:21-24

Discuss:

- Has anyone ever called you a bad name?
- When was the last time you felt really angry?
- What does anger feel like?
- Is it a sin to feel angry?
- Have you ever been accused of doing something you didn't do?

Then let them spray or drop bits of vinegar in each cup of the tin. Talk about how feelings can bubble up sometimes and look different. How do you think Jesus felt when He was accused? Do you think He felt different things at different points in the Easter story?

What and where?

Thank God for feelings, and ask Him for wisdom to express emotions in a Godly way.

EARTHQUAKE

You hear the power of Jesus and recognize Him as God's son.

READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 27:50-56; Mark 15:38-39

MAKE IT TOGETHER (SHAKER): Supplies: colored duct tape, 2 plastic spoons, plastic egg, small rocks or béans

Put rocks or beans inside of the plastic egg

2. Place a spoon on either side of the egg (to make a maraca shape)

Use the duct tape to secure it all together and then cover the entire shape in duct tape

Decorate as you would like

Then shake like crazy!

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

There are a lot of noises in this part of the story— Jesus shouted, the curtain was torn in two, there was an earthquake and tombs broke open. When the Roman centurion saw what happened, he was so amazed it made him realize that Jesus really was God's son and not just a normal man.

Our noise maker's today will remind us of the noises at Jesus' death. When we hear how loud they are, let's be like the Roman soldier and say, Jesus is God's Son!'





READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 27:57-66; Mark 15:42-47; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42

MAKE IT TOGETHER (SEAL):

Supplies: string, streamers, or rope.

1. Use the string to close off a doorway, hallway, or other entry of your house.

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:


When Jesus died, no one expected Him to come back to life. The disciples went away sad. Joseph of Arimathea wrapped Him with linen cloth and spices (which is how the Jewish people took care of dead bodies). Pilate sent Roman soldiers to guard the tomb so no one would steal His body. They sealed

tomb so no one would steal His body. They sealed the tomb so no one could get in.

Jesus was dead. He really died. This death is what sin brings. (Romans 6:23) It's the death we are supposed to have. But Jesus took our sin (remember the vinegar?) and died in our place.

We're going to seal up one of the doorways in our house to remind us of Jesus being dead and sealed up in the tomb. We'll keep it up for several days so we can remember that Jesus was dead for 3 days. we can remember that Jesus was dead for 3 days.

READ IT TOGETHER:

Matthew 28:1-1; Mark 16:1-8; Luke 24:1-12; John 20:1-19

MAKE IT TOGETHER (SUN CATCHER):

Supplies: glue; clear, sparkly, glittery materials (clear plastic bottles, old CDs, glitter foam, tinsel, aluminum foil, tin pie plates, etc.)

- Use round materials as a base for a sun catcher.
- Glue and attach as many sparkly, glittery pieces as possible.
- Hang in window to reflect the light

TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER:

I want you to imagine what those women saw when Jesus came back to life on that Sunday morning.


First it was dawn, which means the sun was just coming up. The sun is super bright!

Second, they saw a tomb with no rock in front of it, it wasn't dark inside anymore!

Third, they saw a bright, shining man—an angel! Jesus came back to life to show us how our hearts can go from dark to light! That resurrection morning was a bright picture of what Jesus does in our hearts—He defeats dark death and makes us alive in His light.

When we see the bright light shining off our sun catchers, let's remember resurrection morning and how Jesús came back to life!

(especially Peter) what He had planned for them. They weren't going to be ordinary fishermen the rest of their lives. They were going to tell others about



RESURRECTION ROLLS

1 can (8 oz) refrigerated crescent dinner rolls

8 large marshmallows melted butter A mixture of cinnamon and sugar

DIRECTIONS:

 Before beginning, you may want to read through John 19 with your family and

2. Hold up a white marshmallow and tell your children that it represents

 Dip the marshmallows in melted butter and explain that it represents the

 Next, dip the marshmallows in the mixture of cinnamon and sugar. This
represents the herbs and spices used to anoint Jesus' body. The spices may also represent how Jesus' death
on the cross was a sweet-smelling sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:2 says, "...and live a life of love, just
as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."
 Take the marshmallow and wrap the crescent dough around it. Make sure you pinch all of the edges
closed. This represents the strips of linen used to wrap Jesus' body. (brush with more melted butter if desired

Place Resurrection Rolls in the tomb (oven) and bake according to package directions.

PRETZEL CROSSES

We prepared two pretzel rods for each cross, breaking one, to make a shorter cross beam. Then, we melted vanilla flavored almond bark in the microwave, according to the directions on the package. Half the package, or six squares, ended up being enough to make fourteen crosses. We poured the melted almond bark into a mug, to make it a little easier to dip the pretzels into. Then, we dipped them, long ones first... ...with the short pretzels going across on top.. ...followed by a tap or two worth of candy sprinkles, before the candy coating had a chance to harden back up. (note: lay the dipped pretzels on a cookie sheet covered in aluminum foil for easy clean up.) Once cooled then you can place in a bowl of jelly beans to have the crosses stand up.

FISHERS OF MEN SNACKS

Since I was in the pretzel aisle anyway, I decided to grab a bag of Snyder's "Butter Snaps", along with a bag of Hershey Kisses®, and a box of fish shaped crackers, for these yummy little treats, as well.

We had a great time making these, and they were so simple. Just line up the pretzel "nets" on a cookie sheet.....and top each one with a Hershey Kiss®. Place the pan in a 350 degree Fahrenheit oven, for a minute or two, until the chocolate is shiny, indicating it's melted (don't overbake, or the chocolate will burn and turn hard and crumbly). Then, press a fish cracker down into each melted chocolate, and place the entire pan into the fridge for a few minutes to cool. While

you're waiting, read the passage from John 21:1-14 about Jesus appearing to the disciples, while they were fishing, after the resurrection.



FAMILY PRAYER IDEA:

GOD WANTS AUTHENTIC PRAYER

God isn't interested in lofty, super-spiritual family prayers. He wants to meet us right where we are, in the middle of messy human life. So we can come to Him right where we are.

I know we often make prayer a pretty formal thing in churches, but remember, Jesus rebuked the Pharisee for making a show out of his prayer (Matthew 6:5) and praised the man who came humbly.

If your family is in the middle of a family crisis, pray about it...no matter how messy it is.
In the midst of a family celebration? Praise Him together for that. If your family needs to make a decision, invite God into that process through prayer.

Praying where we're at teaches kids that no matter what we're going through, God is near. He wants us to acknowledge Him and seek Him and praiše Him throŭgh it all.

HAVE A PRAYER BASKET

Fill a basket with items that you can pull out to use as reminders of what to pray for. Here are some ideas of what to place in the basket:

- An item representing a part of the Easter story: a crown, a nail, a stuffed lamb, etc.
- Missionary prayer letters or pictures
- Christmas cards from the previous year to pray through
- Church bulletin or prayer list
- Memory verse cards or favorite Scripture to pray through
- Small map or postcards from states: pray for the leaders/ government and people who live there
- Put pictures or write the names of relatives, classmates, neighbors, or coworkers on strips of paper and add them to a small jar in your basket
- Items that remind you and your family of a current praise or struggle, like homework for that tricky class or an email for a project that isn't turning out

EASTER GAMES

Here are some fun ideas for games that will promote lots of laughter for all ages! You only have a minute to complete each game! Make sure you have someone recording the fun times so you can watch it later!

EASTER EGG TOWER

For this game you will only need plastic colored eggs. Open all the eggs beforehand. Players start stacking the eggs as fast as they can. Players compete and see who can build the biggest egg tower in one minute. Depending on the amount of people, you may need a lot of plastic eggs.



JELLY BEAN PICK UP

For this game you will need straws and jelly beans. The smaller the jelly bean, the better to make pickup easier. Give each player a handful of jelly beans, a small bowl or basket, and a straw. Players use the straw to pick up one jelly bean

at a time and transfer it into the bowl by sucking up air through the straw. The player with the most jelly beans in their bowl by the end of the minute is the winner.

EGG MATCH

Another simple minute-to-win-it game for Easter parties is this Easter Egg Match game. Simply mismatch all your plastic Easter eggs and put them in a big basket. Players simply open the mismatched eggs and then put them together again with the correct color match. The player who correctly matches the most eggs wins! This one is super fun and harder than you think. Make sure all your plastic eggs are the same brand since many eggs from different companies do not fit together well.

CARROT PATCH

Place family members in pairs and have them face each other, about 10-15 feet apart. (Recommend marking off this distance with masking tape so they know where to stand.) Give one partner a bag of baby carrots. At the opposite end, place a large bowl or box filled with Easter grass. The second partner stands behind the bowl, facing their partner. On "GO," the partner with the carrots tosses them, trying to land the carrots in the grass... or "The Carrot Patch." Any carrot that lands in the grass stays, but any carrot that lands outside of the grass is out. The second partner tosses those carrots back to the first partner so they can try again. I let the partners toss as quickly as they want to in this game, so it's possible both partners might be tossing at the same time. It's a bit crazy, but so fun! The pair with the most carrots in the "patch" at the end of one minute is the winner.

EGG SPOON RACE

This is an easy game with a lot of laughs. The egg spoon race is played like a relay race in teams if you want. All you need is a spoon for each player and a real egg. Line players up outside in a row and have them put their egg on the spoon. Each player must race the other players to the finish line keeping their egg on the spoon. If you are doing a relay then they can run back

to the start line and pass the egg to the next player. You can use raw eggs. This is hilarious when they are dropped. You can use boiled eggs, or plastic eggs to lessen the blow when they are dropped.

OTHER FUN EASTER GAMES

ACTION EASTER EGG HUNT

To prep, make action cards (see list of ideas below) then place different actions inside a plastic Easter egg. When all of the eggs are stuffed, hide them around the house while the kids are distracted or "sequestered" in a room. Then let them loose to find the eggs. They will eagerly run from one room to the next hunting for eggs. Each time they find one, they are to open the egg and do the action inside. They should keep the eggs as they run to find another one. Once all the eggs are found the person who found and did the most actions gets to be the next "hider". Do as many rounds as you need to.

Examples: 5 bunny hops. 10 giant bunny leaps. 12 soldier marches. 6 sideways steps. 4 donkey kicks. 3 frog leaps. 9 ninja kicks. 7 pencil rolls. 2 backwards steps. 8 jumping jacks. 11 claps. 1 somersault. 5 skips. 10 bear crawls. 12 stomps. 6 twirls. 4 boxer punches. 3 eye blinks. 9 tip toes. 7 gallops. 2 turns. 8 twists

EGG MEMORY

This Easter activity is not a minute-to-win-it game but instead a game to play like concentration. You will need







jelly beans and plastic Easter eggs. Make sure you have 2 of eăčh color of jellý bean. Place the jelly beans in rows in the playing area. You can mix the colors up however you want. Use the plastic egg halves to cover each jelly bean. Let players take turns choosing 2 eggs at a time to uncover. If the jelly bean colors match then that player gets to eat those jelly beans and the eggs that were covering them are removed from the game. If they do not match, simply cover the 2 choices with eggs again and let the next player try. Play until all the jelly bean matches have been found. This game works well with little kids that are too young for minute-to-win-it games.

Older kids would have fun too if you make the playing area bigger and use a lot more jelly beans.


EGG ROLL

STAINED GLASS CROSS

SUPPLIES:

- tissue paper (cut into squares)
- clear contact paper (2 sheets per child)
- black paper (cut into two cross outlines per child)

1. Tape down a section of contact paper (sticky side up!)

- 2. Put down a cross outline in the middle of the contact paper. Each child also receives an individual bowl of tissue paper squares. (Taping down the

YARN EGGS

SUPPLIES:

- multi colored yarn
- cardboard
- hot glue/hot glue gun
- scissors
- marker
- 1. Draw an egg shape onto your cardboard at least 4" tall and cut it out with scissors.
- 2. Hot glue the end of your yarn onto one side of your cardboard egg and begin wrapping your yarn around the egg in every which direction.
- 3. Once your cardboard has been completely covered, cut the end of the yarn, and carefully hot glue it to the back. Make a few more.





MARBLED PAPER EASTER EGGS

SUPPLIES:

- shaving cream
- card stock cut into egg shapes or a cross or any shape
- acrylic paint
- tray or box lid
- paintbrush, toothpick, or fork
- newspapers & paper towels
- scraper tool

1. Spray shaving cream onto a tray or box lid and have the kids spread it around. I actually used a cookie sheet lined with tin foil to make clean-up a little easier. 2. Let the kids decide on the colors of paint they want to use for their marbled paper and squirt it on top of the shaving cream. Make paint drops, lines, squiggles. . be creative! 3. Then using a toothpick or another pointy tool (fork, paintbrush) start dragging the paint through the shaving cream. Make straight lines back and forth. Then do it again, but this time go up and down to start creating a marbled look.


- 4. Now time to get messier! Younger kids could need a little help with this step. Take the paper egg and place it on top of the shaving cream. Apply a little pressure to push it down into the paint & shaving cream, then pull it up and place on newspaper for a few minutes.
- 5. Using some sort of scraper tool (I used an old gift card) scrape off the shaving cream and let the paint dry for a bit.
- 6. Once the paint has dried, display your eggs for Easter. I attached mine to some twine to make a little Easter banner to hang up in our house.



Q-TIP LAMB

Supplies:

- Q-tips
- white glue
- a fine tip magic marker
- a pink pencil crayon
- scissors
- white card stock or heavy white paper
- 2 Clothes pins
- red ribbon



2. Next, cut off the tips of the Q-tips. Be prepared – they are going to go flying across the room! Try to rig up some kind of blocker so they can't fly too far after you cut them. I had to send my kids on a mission to pick them all up off the floor.

3. You aren't going to know how many Q-tip pieces you need until you get going.

Just keep cutting more as you run out.

4. Start by adding a small line of glue at one end of the lamb's body. I prefer using white glue because it's easier to work with, but if you don't want to wait overnight for it to dry, you could definitely use your glue gun.

5. Neatly place the Q-tip ends over top of the line of glue.

6. Start with the outer edges and overlap the second layer of Q-tips on top of the first layer. Keep on adding lines of glue, and Q-tips as you work your way across the lamb's body.

7. There's really no magic way of getting it perfect, just do your best to end up with rows of Q-tips that overlap and kind of look like the photo below. You'll want the area that you finish with that has the Q-tip ends exposed to be on the right. You'll be using the head to cover up the ends. Make sure you let the body dry completely before you add the head.

8. Next, move on to the head. Add a small amount of glue to the narrow part of the egg shape and add three Q-tip ends. Make sure you choose Q-tips that have been cut to a similar length to keep it looking neat and tidy.

9. Add more glue and two sideways Q-tips for the ears. Then cover up the ears with more Q-tip pieces so that it looks like the picture to the left.

10. Use a fine tip magic marker to draw the closed eyes with eyelashes. Then draw the little nose and mouth. You can practice on a scrap piece of paper until you are brave enough to draw it.

11.Use a light pink pencil or crayon to draw two little circles for the lamb's rosy cheeks 12.Next, find a scrap piece of skinny ribbon, tie it into a small bow and glue it to the top

of the lamb's head.

13.Make sure you wait for everything to dry completely before you glue the head to the body – you might want to leave it over night. It takes a bit of effort to get all those Q-tips lined up perfectly, so it's extremely frustrating when they all shift out of place because they weren't quite dry! If you don't have enough time to wait, just use a glue gun instead.

14.Once the lamb is dry, take two clothes pins and glue them to the back of the lamb.
I used white glue, but again, a glue gun would be way faster!









PAPER PLATE CALVARY HILL

Supplies:

- a paper plate
- brown paper
- crayons
- scissors
- glue

 Cut out a half-circle in the center of your plate and fold it up.

2. Have the child color the plate. My kids made them look like Calvary hill with a tomb at the base. I showed my kids a little about perspective. So we made our paths to the crosses wider at the edge of the plate and narrower at the crosses, so the crosses look farther away.

3.Then, cut out strips of brown paper and form three crosses. Glue them onto the hill top.



TALKING TO YOUR KIDS ABOUT DEATH

The story of Jesus' death and resurrection is often glossed over for children. It is understandable as we don't want to make our children afraid of the story of Jesus. We don't want them to be introduced to themes of death and torture too early.

However, I do not believe the crux of this story can be glossed over. I believe children can and do understand and appreciate the story of Jesus' death and resurrection—even with all its big themes.

Here are a few tips to help you navigate conversations you will surely have as you travel through the story and Easter activities:

1. **Don't explain everything**. When your children ask a question, you don't have to give every single detail. I don't explain that Jesus was probably naked and the whip He was beaten with had bones and glass attached to it. But I do tell my kids that people whipped Him and beat Him.


2. Don't worky about how much they understand. Children only understand as much as they understand (That's brilliant, isn't it?) When my son thinks of hammering, he imagines Handy Manny. He doesn't understand what nailing a railroad sized spike into someone's wrist would do. He knows it's bad. He knows it would hurt. But he doesn't really understand it. And that's ok. He doesn't have to. I only want him to see the story with his 5 year old eyes.

3. **KŃOW YOUŔ CHILDREN**. If you have a sensitive child, you may need to skip over some details. When my daughter was younger she would back away from pictures of Jesus on the cross. It frightened her—but not because she was genuinely afraid. It was because she recognized the severity and seriousness of the story.

4. **Focus on the good parts**. You don't have to say, "Jesus was whipped for you!" or "You were supposed to be nailed to the cross." Instead, talk about how much Jesus loved the world, how He was obedient to His Father, how He cared for His followers and His family even in death. Focus on the resurrection and the wonderful interactions He had with His followers after He came back to life.

5. ALLOW THE HOLY SPIRIT TO SPEAK TO YOUR CHILDREN. This may be the year your child understands and believes what Jesus did for him or her. Let the Holy Spirit speak to them. Let their hearts be broken. Let your children think about, mull over, and wonder about the story. Let God do the work in their hearts. Pray for the Holy Spirit to work before each experience and pray that your words come from God when explaining.
